About the Young Scientists Festival

Young Scientist Festival is established by Jamili Charity Foundation with the aim of motivating creative young researchers/students, boosting the initiative startups, supporting the knowledge-based products and completing the cycle of innovation to wealth creation.

YSF is organized annually in November and is open to young researchers (from 18 to 40 years old) to register their applied ideas from July to September in the online system of the YSF.

The selected ideas receive administrative and educational support in addition to the financial support to develop the registered ideas/projects.
